Bookfair

Closure of Rascals Out of School Care

We were saddened to hear the news of the impending closure of Rascals last week and am sure that you will join us in thanking Tim and Emma for the fantastic wraparound care that they have provided for our families over the last 20 years. They will certainly be a loss to our school community and we wish them every happiness in their well-earned retirement!

Moving forward we are very pleased that Activ8 will be providing Wraparound childcare from September. This will initially be hosted in the Infant school (for both Infant and Junior children), with the longer-term aim of moving into the Rascals building once this becomes available.

Staffing update - Belated news!



We are delighted to share with you that Mrs Rachel Bean gave birth to baby Otto on Friday 26th May. Both are doing really well and we are hoping to meet Otto face-to-face next Thursday when Mrs Bean and her husband Josh bring him in to visit us.

Early Transition - Monday 10th July

Our early transition to new classes is fast approaching. The children will visit their new classes on Wednesday 5th July for the morning and will then move into those classes from **Monday 10th July until the end of term.** Our current Y2 children will relocate to the Reception classrooms where they will become our temporary Y3 classes. More specific details about new classes/teachers and transition plans for our current Y2's will be sent out following the visit days on 5th July.



Open evening / 'Meet the Teacher' – Thursday 13th July 3.30 – 6.00pm



This year we will once again be holding our open evening where parents are able to view their child's work and meet their new class teacher.

At 3.45pm and 5.00pm there will be short (15 min) presentations to parents in the children's new classes. This is an opportunity for you to meet your child's new class teacher, see their classroom and find out

about expectations for the year group. Please do try to make one of these meetings, as they will help prepare you for the coming year.

New registration time from September 2023

You may be aware that the Government White Paper, issued in March 2022, proposed that Primary schools offer 32.5 hours per week of learning for children. Whilst this paper has since been 'shelved' and the expectation no longer exists, it prompted discussions between schools and Governors about what hours are currently provided.



Our staff and Governors have decided that in order to slightly increase our provision we will amend the school day so that from 1st September 2023 registers will be taken at 8.55am instead of the current 9.00am. This means that children will be required to be in school by 8.55am each morning and arrival after this time will be marked as 'late'.

This slight amendment to the school day means that no change is required to the Junior school hours and nor is the teachers directed time impacted upon. In addition, the children will benefit from an additional 25 minutes of learning per week. Doors will continue to open at 8.50am and the main playground gates will be closed at 8.55am.

We have three weeks until the end of term so you may want to start practising now!

Llbrary/Reading books

As we approach the end of term we will begin to collect in any Library or Reading books that you may have at home. Please have a good look at home so that all books can be returned to school and we can complete our audit and reorganisation during the summer break. Thank you.



Can you help?



If you have any spare Duplo, Lego or other small construction kits which you are happy to donate to the school then the Midday Meals team would be very happy to have this to support their lunchtime activities. They are also looking for dressing up outfits – firemen, police and ambulance. Thank you in advance.

Leaving school early at end of term

In previous years we have had a significant number of last-minute phone calls and emails asking to collect children early from school on the last day of term for medical appointments and emergency dental appointments. Once again, we will not be permitting this, as this has a significant impact on the office staff who end up spending most of their afternoon going backwards and forwards collecting children from classes, and this severely limits their ability to get on with their work.

We do try to support parents in making their arrangements, so if you know that you have a medical or dentist appointment on this day or that you need to collect your child early for travelling purposes, then please let the office staff know well in advance. This will enable us to plan ahead and arrange one pick-up time for all children. Last minute, on the day requests will unfortunately be declined. Thank you for your support in this.

Absences from School

If parent/carers need to request absence from school, please ensure that an Absence Request Form is completed in advance of the time off. This form can be found in the stand in the school foyer and also on the school website. Please note that time off either directly before or after a holiday will be unauthorised unless evidence is provided to support the same.

Governors Corner - Parents Questionnaire 2023

Thank you for completing the Parents Questionnaire this year. We received over 100 completed forms and these were collated and analysed by the school Governors prior to distribution to the school staff.

Parent's questionnaires are important. The results helps the school get a better understanding of parents' opinions and perspective towards the school, what is working well, but more importantly, helps the school make informed decisions on how to improve.

Overall, the results obtained were very encouraging. There was unanimous agreement, 99% agree/strongly agree, that every child is happy, feels safe at school, and would recommend the school to another parent. 95% say they have not had any concerns with bullying at school, and where they have, the school has dealt with them quickly and effectively. Similarly, the school gives the children with special educational needs and/or disabilities the support they need to succeed.

General consensus, 98% agree/strongly agree, is that every child is doing well at the school with a good majority, 80% agree/strongly agree, that the schools supports their child's wider personal development and informs parents on how their child is performing, albeit that some parents would like a wider selection of clubs and activities.
