#### Midday Meals Vacancies

We currently have vacancies for various midday meals roles, with a range of flexibilities. If you feel you might be interested in any of the following then please speak with the Mr Hill (School Business Manager) for further details:



 Casual hours – sometimes at quite short notice, to cover staff absence. This is usually for 1 hour per day and involves supervising play on the playground and supporting the children in the hall while they eat.

- Regular hours 5 days per week from between 30 120 minutes per day, either supervising play, the lunch hall and setting up/clearing away tables.
- Part-time hours we can offer a range of flexibilities to suit you, from 1-5 days per week, between 30 120 minutes per day.

# School Council

#### Spotlight on Safeguarding

With a number of new staff having joined us this term we thought we would share how safeguarding is part of the recruitment process. It's a vital part of creating a safe and positive environment and making a commitment to keep children safe from harm.



Recruiting staff can be a lengthy and complex process. Having a safer recruitment policy statement in place is a vital first step towards keeping the children and young people who have contact with staff and volunteers safe. These will ensure that staff and volunteers are recruited safely and fairly, and that children's safety is being considered at every stage of the process.

Things we take into consideration:

Every advert for a role that includes work with children includes a statement about your commitment to keeping children safe.

We include an overview in our application pack as part of our safer recruitment process so that candidates understand what information will be sought from them and why, and what will be expected of them at each stage of the process.

Applicants should complete a self-disclosure form before the interview and bring it along with them in a sealed envelope.

Identity checks are carried out and we check at least two references per candidate

We explore gaps in CVs

We carry out DBS checks

We ask safeguarding questions in the interview

Where possible we visit candidates in their current school and talk to their headteacher.

# Locality Code of Conduct

We are fortunate to have very positive and respectful relationships with the vast majority of our parents and carers, however sadly this is not always the case across our neighbouring schools. Therefore, as a Locality group of schools, we have adopted a 'Code of Conduct' which sets out behaviour which will not be tolerated by staff in our schools and actions that may be taken if the code is broken. This is attached for your information and a copy is also available on the website.

Our staff work extremely hard and are very dedicated to their work, going well above and beyond that which is expected of them. We know that from time to time, things go wrong and we ask that you continue to work together with us, through mutual trust and understanding, in order that we can resolve concerns and continue our good relationships with you.

#### **School Development Priorities**

At our INSET day in the summer term, staff and governors met to identify school priorities for 2023-2024. Each year the school is required to identify areas that need to be developed and possibly improved. These become the basis of the School's Improvement Plan and throughout the year staff, governors and children work together to achieve these targets. By sharing

# **A Few Reminders!**



- Medication

If your child uses an asthma inhaler or requires medication during the school day, please ensure that the office has up to date details of the treatments required and that you have completed the relevant paperwork.

# - Emergency Contact Numbers and Collection During the School Day

It is important that we have the correct contact numbers on which to reach you in case of emergency. If you have recently changed your telephone numbers, please inform the office as soon as possible. If you need to collect your child from school during the school day, please go to the main entrance/office.

#### - Play/Climbing Equipment

Children are not permitted to use the play equipment or Early Years equipment before or after school. This also applies to younger/older siblings. Please ensure that your children stay on the playground with you during these times.

#### - Jewellery

For safety reasons, children should not wear jewellery in school. Children with pierced ears should wear studs only please. Plain, dark colour watches, but not the game-type, are permitted. In accordance with advice from West Sussex County Council, jewellery may not be worn for any physical activity. All earrings should be taken out by the children for their PE lessons, watches removed and long hair tied back.

#### - Dogs on Site

Dogs are not permitted on school grounds. If necessary, they can be tied to the perimeter fence while dropping off or collecting your child/ren.

#### - Parking on Site

Parking is not permitted on the school grounds unless prior arrangement has been agreed with the school office.

#### - Snacks and Drinks Policy

The children have one break time each day (morning) when they are permitted to eat their healthy snacks. Children are encouraged to bring in a healthy snack to eat during their break, which are listed in the school healthy snacks policy, as shown below. No other snack is permitted.











- **Mild Cheese** (*not* processed products such as Cheese Strings and Dairy Dunkers)
- Breadsticks
- Plain Rice Cakes
- Wholemeal Pitta Bread
- Fresh Vegetables
- Fresh Fruits (not fruit winders/yoyos/fruit flakes etc...)
- Plain Raisins (not yoghurt coated)



In addition, all the children will receive a free piece of fruit or vegetable every day, usually at mid-morning, as part of a government scheme to encourage children to eat their daily 5 portions of fruit and vegetables.

If your child has any allergies or medical reasons why these snacks are not appropriate, then please come and talk to us.

# Water

Children are encouraged to bring a water bottle to school to keep in class. **Children are only permitted to have plain water in their drink bottles.** They are able to take drinks of water from this throughout the day. Juice, squash or flavoured water are not permitted.
