<u>School Grounds Day – a Big Thank you</u>



Staffing update



We are delighted to share with you that Miss Anna Woodiwiss is getting married to her fiancé Alistair during the Easter break. Upon returning to school Miss Woodiwiss will be using her married name 'Mrs Tobin' going forward. I'm sure you will join us in wishing both Anna and Alistair a very happy wedding day with lots of sunshine!

Very sadly we are having to say goodbye to Mrs Leanne Wallace (YR TLA) at Easter. Leanne joined us in September and has proved herself to be a real asset to the school and a highly valuable member of our team. Saying goodbye to Leanne is not a decision that we wanted to make however, in order to balance a budget for 2024/25 we have been forced to make a cut in staffing. Leanne will be very much missed and we hope that in the future we will be able to afford to bring her back to our team.



Due to Leanne leaving, we will be moving some of the support staff around after Easter in order that we can best continue to meet the needs of the children. Miss Laura Brooks will be moving from Y1 to Reception and Mrs Sally West will be moving from Y2 to Y1. Within year groups staff may be moving between classes according to daily timetables. If you have any questions please speak to your child's class teacher.

School Budget update

I am sure that many of you are aware from the media that school budgets have been struggling for a number of years and like many other schools around us, we now find ourselves with a deficit budget and



income that does not match costs. We have already been forced to make cuts to our support staff team in order to set a budget for 2024/25 and going forward we are likely to have to make further cuts in staffing.

The school currently has a deficit of £75,000. This is due to a number of reasons including increased costs of services and resources, unfunded Government pay rises and falling income. You may not be aware that schools are primarily funded by pupil numbers and that Nationally the birth rate has fallen. All schools around us are now struggling with this fall in roll and Infant schools are particularly hit hard as they only have three year groups and class sizes are limited to 30 children. The loss of pupil numbers means a loss of income.

Currently we have only 79 children in YR, meaning a loss of approximately £50,600 in income for this year (23/24). Our predicted numbers for September 2024 are also lower than in the past and we estimate that this will mean a further drop in income of a similar amount and possibly more. We simply cannot fund the resources and staffing we currently hold with a drop of around £100,000 in income, plus a deficit of £75,000 on top.

So, what can you do to help?

Firstly, and most importantly, **spread the word that we have spaces**! Our current Y1 cohort is full however, from September we will have space in both YR and Y1. The school continues to be a good school with excellent facilities on offer. The fall in roll is not a reflection on the school or staff – this is a National issue that all schools are facing. More pupils means more income!

Secondly, if you are able to, then please **do make financial donations towards trips and events when asked, however small.** The school no longer has any money to support families who choose not to contribute and we really do not want to have to cancel events going forward however, we may have no option but to do so, which will be very sad for our children.

Finally, if you work for a company who would like to **sponsor us** (perhaps for a project or trip/event) or **donate to us** (paper, pencils etc), then please do put them in touch with us. Stay & Play Workshops



Spotlight on Safeguarding- PANTS! The Underwear Rule

As part of our PSHE curriculum we teach children about the importance of keeping themselves safe, which links to our Rights Respecting School ethos. After the holidays we will all be taking part in the NSPCC "Speak out, Stay Safe" programme as well.

The NSPCC promotes 'PANTS: The Underwear Rule' and we teach the children about this, through the Pantosaurus song. The messages are practical, reassuring and age appropriate.

The rule reminds children that:

- Their body belongs to them
- They have a right to say no, and
- They should always tell an adult if they are upset or worried.


